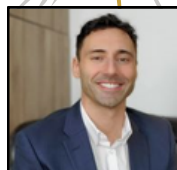

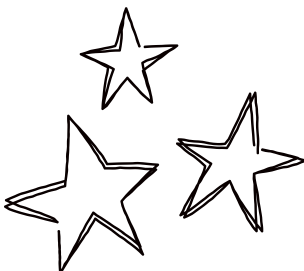

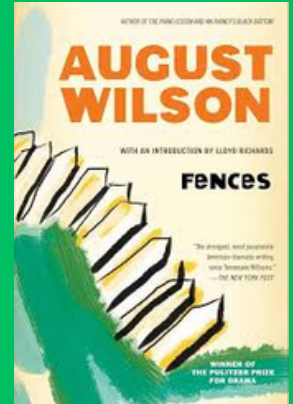

BOOK OF THE MONTH...

In 8th grade ELA, students are reading the play Fences by Pulitzer Prize winning author, August Wilson. This play is set in Pittsburgh, PA in the 1950s and follows the tragically flawed character, Troy, as he navigates through difficult family relationships and is forced to deal with his own past trauma head on. Students are learning how to use stage directions to inform their reading, analyzing the development of theme throughout an act and comparing and contrasting different characters' perspectives to see how it creates conflict and tension. The most exciting element is that students get to act out scenes from the play!

MONTHLY SUBJECT FOCUS: MATHEMATICS

With the beginning of the calendar year, most grade levels will begin new units! Through these IM (Illustrative Mathematics) lessons, scholars engage in concrete, pictorial and abstract thinking to understand the Next Generation Mathematics Standards. Teachers start each lesson with a "warm up" to hook the students in the day's learning. Then, they work together through 1-2 activities before completing a "cool down" to assess their learning.

Check out each grade's current unit of study:

- **Kindergarten:** Understanding Addition and Subtraction
- **First:** Numbers to 99
- **Second:** Addition and Subtraction on the Number Line
- **Third:** Relating Multiplication to Division
- **Fourth:** Multiplicative Comparison and Measurement
- **Fifth:** Wrapping Up Multiplication and Division with Multi-Digit Numbers
- **Sixth:** Dividing Fractions
- **Seventh:** Rational Number Arithmetic
- **Eighth:** Functions and Volume

This month's spotlight is on Ms. Williams and Ms. Haber's 3rd Grade class! We asked students, **"What is your resolution for the New Year?"**



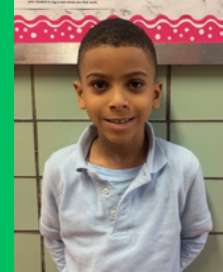
Mialynn

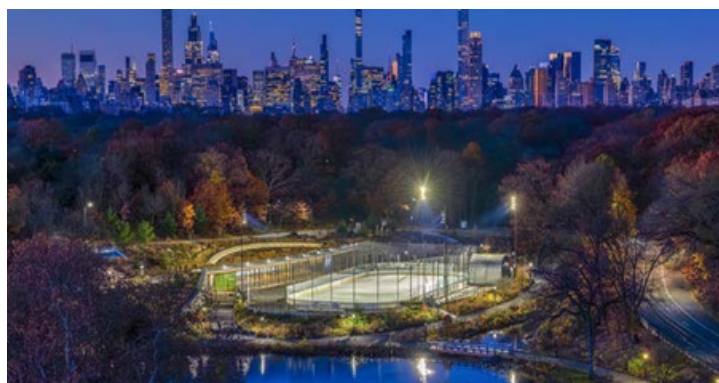

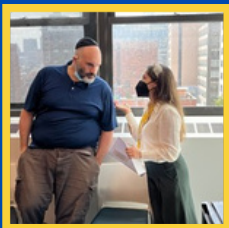
