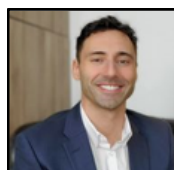

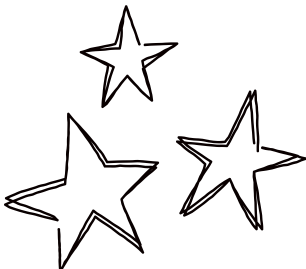

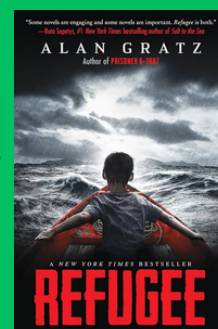
A Message From...

Hello FLI families! I'm excited to share we will be done with New York State testing by May 15th. On May 22, we are going to hold our last round of Parent-Teacher-Conferences. Even though you will not see your child's report card for term 3 just yet, you will get an opportunity to talk to your child's teacher(s) about their progress and their current grade. This is an opportunity for you to talk to your child about how they are doing in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, so you can do a final push before the end of term 3, which is June 11th. Lastly, we will not have an Honor's Assembly for term 3, but we will still award students for Honor Roll, Principal's Honor Roll, and Perfect Attendance on their term 3 report card. Let's keep the momentum going!

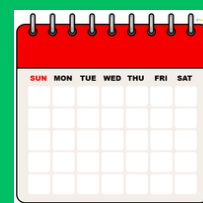
BOOK OF THE MONTH...

Sixth grade students will begin reading Refugee through which they will explore the conflict of fleeing through different characters' perspectives. In Refugee, students will read the story of Isabel (1994 Cuba), Josef (1930s Nazi Germany), and Mahmoud (2015 Syria), three young refugees from three different time periods, as they flee their respective homelands in search of safety. Their journeys are fraught with life-threatening dangers, with all three fleeing violence in search of a new home. The narratives eventually intertwine, highlighting themes of resilience and the universal, enduring struggle of refugees.

MONTHLY SUBJECT FOCUS: MATHEMATICS

With the end of the school year fast approaching, all grade levels are beginning their final unit this month. Through these IM (Illustrative Mathematics) lessons, scholars engage in concrete, pictorial and abstract thinking to understand the Next Generation Mathematics Standards. Teachers start each lesson with a "warm up" to hook the students in the day's learning. Then, they work together through 1-2 activities before completing a "cool down" to assess their learning.

- **Kindergarten:** Solid Shapes All Around Us
- **First:** Geometry and Time
- **Second:** Equal Groups
- **Third:** Two-Dimensional Shapes
- **Fourth:** Properties of Two-Dimensional Shapes
- **Fifth:** Shapes on the Coordinate-Plane
- **Sixth:** Data Sets and Distribution
- **Seventh:** Angles, Triangles, and Prisms
- **Eighth:** Exponents and Scientific Notation

I appreciate my 4th grade teacher Ms. Khan. I use to get bullied but she always confronted them and let me talk to her.

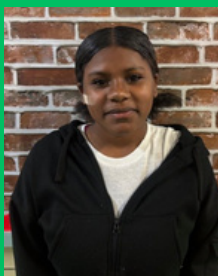


J'yonnah

This option protects your benefits. While the card is blocked, no one can use it or steal it



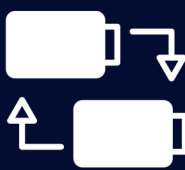
PROTECT ACCOUNT

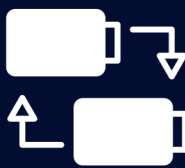

What is the Save for College Program?

The NYC Kids RISE Save for College Program provides families, schools, and communities with a way to work together to save for and invest in their children's futures.

It is a scholarship and savings program designed to make college and career training more accessible for public school students. The Program was created so that **every NYC public school student** can dream big, build financial assets for college and career training, and receive community support along the way. NYC Kids RISE, a non-profit organization, manages the Save for College Program in **partnership with NYC Public Schools and the City of New York**.

How does the Program work?

Eligible children are **automatically enrolled and receive a free NYC Scholarship Account with an initial \$100** unless their parents or guardians choose not to participate and opt out. Families can earn **up to \$175 in rewards by completing steps**, and **communities can support by contributing additional money** to groups of children's NYC Scholarship Accounts through **Community Scholarships**. Funds allocated to NYC Scholarship Accounts are invested in a 529 account that is owned and managed by NYC Kids RISE on behalf of participating students.

After activating their child's NYC Scholarship Account, families can open and connect a separate college and career savings account that they own for the benefit of their child. Then, they can start saving money in ways and amounts that make sense for their financial circumstances.

Who can participate?

As of school year 2025-2026, students in **kindergarten through fourth grade** at NYC public schools (including participating charter schools) are eligible to participate in the Program, **no matter what their family income or immigration status is**.

Because the Program was piloted in geographic School District 30 starting in 2017, every kindergarten through fifth-grade student in the 39 pilot schools is eligible to participate.

When can I activate my child's free NYC Scholarship Account?

My child is starting kindergarten or entering grades 1-4 in a NYC public school (or participating charter school) for the first time

You can activate and view your child's NYC Scholarship Account in **January 2026!** Your school and NYC Kids RISE will notify you when your child's account is ready.

If you already activated an NYC Scholarship Account for another child, you will be able to log back in to Savings Tracker at nyckr.org/intro-login and add your newly eligible child in January.

My child is currently in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th grade and attended a NYC public school (or participating charter school) in the 2024-2025 school year

¿Qué es el Programa de Ahorro para la Universidad?

El Programa de Ahorro para la Universidad (Save for College Program) de NYC Kids RISE brinda a las familias, escuelas y comunidades una oportunidad de trabajar juntos para ahorrar e invertir en el futuro de sus hijos/as.

Es un programa de becas y ahorros diseñado para hacer que la universidad y la formación profesional sean más asequibles para los estudiantes de escuelas públicas. El Programa se creó para que **todos los estudiantes de las escuelas públicas de la ciudad de Nueva York** puedan soñar en grande, acumular activos financieros para la universidad y la formación profesional y recibir apoyo comunitario en el camino. NYC Kids RISE, una organización sin fines de lucro, administra el Programa de Ahorro para la Universidad en asociación con el Sistema de Escuelas Públicas de la Ciudad de Nueva York (NYC Public Schools) y la ciudad de Nueva York.

¿Cómo funciona el Programa?

Los niños elegibles son **inscritos automáticamente** y reciben una **Cuenta de Beca NYC (NYC Scholarship Account)** con **\$100 iniciales**, a menos que sus madres, padres o tutores decidan no participar y se excluyan del programa. Las familias pueden obtener **hasta \$175 en recompensas completando pasos adicionales** y las comunidades pueden brindar su apoyo **aportando dinero adicional** a las Cuentas de Beca NYC de grupos de niños a través de **Becas Comunitarias**. Los fondos asignados a las Cuentas de Beca NYC se invierten en una cuenta 529 que es propiedad de y administrada por NYC Kids RISE en nombre de los estudiantes participantes.

Después de activar la Cuenta de Beca NYC de su hijo/a, las familias pueden abrir y vincular su propia cuenta de ahorros separada para la universidad y la formación profesional para el beneficio de su hijo/a. Así pueden empezar a ahorrar dinero en las formas y los montos que mejor se adapten a sus circunstancias financieras.

¿Quiénes pueden participar?

A partir del año académico 2025-2026, los estudiantes **de kínder a cuarto grado** en las escuelas públicas de la ciudad de Nueva York (incluidas las escuelas charter participantes) son elegibles para participar en el Programa, **independientemente de los ingresos o el estado migratorio de su familia**.

Dado que el Programa se puso a prueba en el Distrito Escolar geográfico 30 a partir de 2017, todos los estudiantes de kínder a quinto grado que asisten a una de las 39 escuelas de prueba son elegibles para participar.

¿Cuándo puedo activar la Cuenta de Beca NYC gratuita de mi hijo/a?

Mi hijo/a está empezado el kínder o ingresando a 1.º, 2.º, 3.º o 4.º grado en una escuela pública de la ciudad de Nueva York (o en una escuela charter participante) por primera vez.

¡Puede activar y ver la Cuenta de Beca NYC de su hijo/a en **enero de 2026**! Su escuela y NYC Kids RISE le notificarán cuando la cuenta de su hijo/a esté lista.

Si ya activó una Cuenta de Beca NYC para otro hijo/a, podrá volver a iniciar sesión en la Herramienta de control de ahorro en nyckr.org/intro-login y agregar a su hijo/a recientemente elegible en enero.



Por ahora, infórmese sobre el programa en nyckidsrise.org o participe en un taller virtual en nyckr.org/events-cal.

Mi hijo/a está actualmente en 1.º, 2.º, 3.º o 4.º grado y asistió a una escuela pública de la ciudad de Nueva York (o a una escuela charter participante) en el año escolar 2024-2025.
