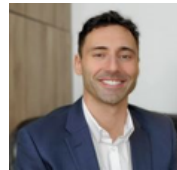

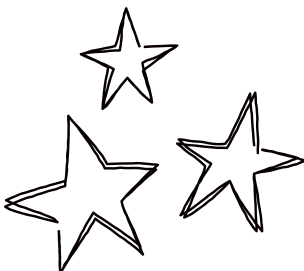

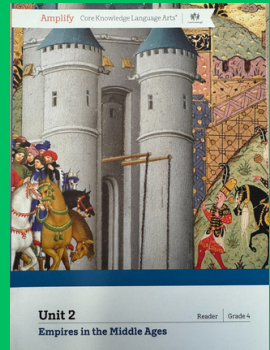
A Message From...

Greetings FLI families! November is a busy month for us here at FLI. As the first marking period comes to a close, students will be taking their English Language Arts and Mathematics benchmark assessments. These summative assessments are given three times each school year: November, March and June. Teachers, consultants and administrators review the data to better understand how our students are mastering grade level standards. Teachers are then better able to tailor their lesson plans to meet each students' academic needs. Parent Teacher conferences will begin in December and we look forward to sharing updates about your student's progress!

BOOK OF THE MONTH...

Fourth grade students are currently reading and learning about Empires in the Middle Ages. During this unit, students will learn about both the history of the Middle Ages in Europe as well as the Islamic Medieval Empires. As students read and explore this topic, they will see how the relationship between the Christian Church and the rulers of the region developed as well as how the concurrent Islamic Empires in the Middle Ages looks at events in other parts of the world.

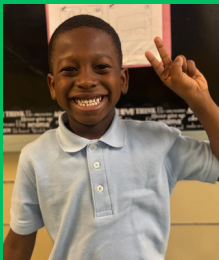

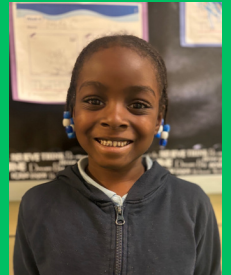

The Foundation of FLI

FLI was founded on the basis of six core values that we believe are just as essential to teach as our curriculum. Our mission is to develop the whole child so they have all the tools necessary to continue to be successful in all future chapters of their lives. While teaching into these core values is a daily task, each month is dedicated to a specific value. By the end of the month, teachers and classmates nominate students in each class as an exemplar of that value. These students are then celebrated at our monthly community circles.

Community Circles

Each month FLI hosts both a lower and middle school community circle organized by the school guidance counselors, reading specialist, MS teacher and school dean. Community circle embodies the style of a true morning meeting where as a group we take part in a greeting, share and activity. This month, in order to celebrate Halloween, select students from each class participated in a mummy making contest. Both students and staff loved this activity and with teamwork and cooperation, so many creative mummies were made! Community circles will always take place in the school's gymnasium from 8:30AM - 8:45AM at the end of each month.
